

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

In March of 2022, the Episcopal Church USA commissioned a study entitled "Jesus in America." It is an effort designed to outline the current state of involvement in organized religion in the U.S., and in Christianity in particular. One section held a special interest for me. It is called the "Impact of Covid–19 on Religious Activity." The findings here were not

surprising in some ways. Regular in-person attendance of religious services dropped during the pandemic. Overall, the pandemic has decreased participation in organized religion, or religious activities, for about a third of Americans. For whatever reason, many people who formerly attended church regularly have not returned to this practice. Almost half of Americans (45%) found being outdoors in nature to be the most spiritually fulfilling activity, followed by prayer (42%), and giving to charity (28%). Obviously, any conclusions drawn from this data would be subjective. It does seem, however, that many have decided to cease the traditional form of communal worship and " go it alone." I find this ironic, in light of the emphasis in the scriptures on followers of Jesus needing to practice their faith within the Christian community, where they are supported by other believers, and given opportunities for service.

It is also interesting to contrast this response with how the early Christians responded to plagues. Historians mount a powerful argument, that one of the principal reasons Christianity grew in the 1st–4th centuries, was because of the mercy organized Christian communities displayed toward people who suffered physically, and in particular, how Christian groups showed mercy during two massive plagues that ravaged the Roman Empire. In the year 165, a devastating epidemic swept through the Roman Empire. Medical historians suspect this was the first appearance of smallpox in the West. During the 15 year duration of the epidemic, a third of the population likely died of it. On all sides, family, friends, and neighbors, died horribly. No one knew how to treat the stricken, nor did most people try. Since the disease was understood to be contagious, victims were abandoned to die when their first symptom

appeared. Christian communities met the obligation to care for the sick, rather than desert them, and thereby saved enormous numbers of lives. The impact of Christian mercy also spread the faith exponentially. The church grew, because it stayed together and was faithful to it's calling of service. This is what Christian communities of faith, and the institutions they support, have done throughout the centuries, in the midst of suffering and death. Christians were able to have an impact, because they served side by side in prayer, worship, and service.

However you might view this comparison, I think there is a lesson to be learned here. In these difficult times, we need each other more than ever. See you in church.

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:24 - 25)

to see what Trinity is all about! If you are willing to help with set up or clean- up, please see Lisa Bedell or Kathy Hansen. Hope to see you there!!








