FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

"The celebration of Advent is possible only to those who are troubled in soul, who know themselves to be poor and imperfect, and who look forward to something greater to come." – Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Advent symbolizes the church's present situation in these "last days" (Acts 2:17, Hebrews 1:2) as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to

consummate his eternal kingdom. The church is in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament in exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God's gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and on this basis, they called for God to once again act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration, while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people.

In this light, the Advent hymn "O Come O Come, Emmanuel" perfectly represents the church's cry during the Advent season:

O come, o come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, That mourns the lonely exile here until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

While Israel would have sung this song in expectation of Christ's first coming, the church now sings the song to commemorate the first coming of Christ and also the expectation of the second coming. My sincere wishes for a blessed Advent season for all of you. Join us as we prepare for the coming.

Senior Darriers Report

Several projects which have been in motion for a couple of months are ending. Your vestry members have been hard at work, and I thank them all for their diligence.

- Cat Gaines and her Garden Committee have been working with Greenstate to rework the Bridges/Pruitt Garden. The irrigation system is working well, a garden plan is in place (please see this posted in the Parish Hall), the Trinity Church sign on Chestnut Street has been repainted and the garden lighting is being evaluated for upgrades.
- The Endowment Committee, led by Annette Burke, made a recommendation for distribution
 of funds in the amount of \$7,500 which is 4% of a 36-month rolling average from the
 Endowment account held by the Diocese. Funding went to the Christian Care Center
 which lost a substantial amount of funds from United Way and a day care match at First
 Presbyterian for our smallest Ukrainian friend.
- Vestry encourages our members to participate in two Christmas Outreach activities spearheaded by Cherry Beasley. Adult hats, gloves, and socks for those coming to the Lumberton Christian Care Center and supplies for 4-year-old special needs classrooms of the Public Schools of Robeson County. The drop off boxes are in the Parish Hall.
- And finally, our rental property is now occupied. A lovely couple who has recently moved here from Italy. Please say hello when you see them coming and going in the parking lot.
